Do It on Purpose

In order to start helping others and reaching them with the love of God, we are going to have to get ourselves off our minds, out of our prayers and out of our conversations. We have to start living life with purpose—on purpose!

Those two little words "on purpose" have become very important to me. They've actually been quite life-changing for me in the last few years, because I have realized that you cannot wait to feel like it. You cannot wait to think it's a good idea. You cannot wait to even want to. You just have to do it on purpose! Now I'm not saying it's bad to ask God for things for yourself, but if you want to receive true victory...if you want to be happy...you are going to have to start thinking of others first.

More Than Your Money

In 2 Corinthians 8 (AMPC), when Paul was talking to the Corinthian believers about their giving, he gave them the example of the churches in Macedonia. He said in verse 5, Nor [was this gift of theirs merely the contribution] that we expected, but first they gave themselves to the Lord and to us [as His agents] by the will of God [entirely disregarding their personal interests, they gave as much as they possibly could, having put themselves at our disposal to be directed by the will of God]. That just amazed me, because they didn't just give their money—they weren't bucket plunkers—but they gave themselves.

I wonder how many of us are willing to write our name down and stick that in the offering plate. Romans 12:1 (NLT) leaps to my heart. And so, dear brothers and sisters, I plead with you to give your bodies to God because of all he has done for you. Let them be a living and holy sacrifice—the kind he will find acceptable. This is truly the way to worship him.

Being part of *The Love Revolution* is going to cost us something, but it doesn't always mean our money...we have to be willing to give ourselves as a sacrifice. And that means loving people on the job, in the neighborhood, in your home and loving the poor, lost, and needy enough to put your time and effort into it. We're going to have to stop complaining because of all the petty inconveniences that come our way and start really loving people.

More Than Words

I once heard a story that many years ago in Russia, an evangelist came and was walking around telling people, "Jesus loves you. Jesus loves you." He was handing out Gospel tracts, and one lady said, "You know what? Your sermon and Gospel tract isn't going to fill my belly." How can they hear about God, when they can't hear past their rumbling bellies? Sometimes we need to just show people love by meeting their needs and meeting their needs and meeting their needs...and then once the pain is gone... we can share with them about Christ.

Our Power

Can I tell you what the power of the Gospel is? Love. Nothing else! Love is the power of the Gospel. It is the highest form of spiritual warfare that we can do. One person—one—totally committed, dedicated and submitted to God makes hell tremble. So just think what a bunch of "ones" can do.

God said to me once, "Why don't you study the Bible to see how Jesus did spiritual warfare, instead of screaming at demons all day?" Jesus didn't have to go in and clean out the demons. When He came in, they left. Romans 12:21 (AMP) says, *Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good*.

One thing is for sure, Jesus went about doing good, and we should too. That's walking in love!

Let's Go to War

Every single one of us needs to decide right now to declare war on selfishness. Let's declare war on selfishness in our families, in our homes, at the workplace... Let's get up every day and say, "God, I give myself to You. I dedicate myself to You."

Let's make an announcement to the kingdom of darkness: "I will not live a little bitty life where there's only room in it for me. I will not be a selfish, self-centered person. I've got the love of God in me and everywhere I go, it is going to ooze out." When we see a need, we are going to meet it. We don't need a 12-hour prayer meeting; we are going to meet people's needs, unless God tells us otherwise.

We are going to saturate everyone around us with the love of Christ through simple acts of love, every single day—on purpose.

Shalom Community Lutheran Church Annual Meeting Minutes January 27, 2019

Call to Order and Opening Prayer

President Rolinda Sanders opened the meeting with prayer.

Ministry Highlights of 2018

Rolinda pointed out the slide show of pictures from 2018, commenting on the many opportunities to for study and growth, baptisms, Don Hacker's funeral, special events such as Shalom movie matinees and joint ministry events listed on page 3 of the annual meeting handout. She thanked the women's group for the birthday, anniversary, encouragement and get well cards they send.

Committee Reports

Dalen Gosseling gave the Building Committee report, saying that work is still being done to clarify our property line south of the Ministry Center, but documentation has been found indicating the disputed land belongs with the property Shalom purchased. Ken and Michelle Knutson have been asked to draft a building design that could function as worship space and address other needs, and the congregation will be invited to share reactions and decide whether to proceed with expanding our facility.

Monica Gosseling gave the Worship Planning Team report, saying that the work group generally meets about 3 times per year, discussing issues related to worship. Discussions this year have looked at the declining attendance for Thanksgiving and Lenten services. Participants in 2018 were Monica, Pastor Becky, Roger Anderson, Dorothy Carlson, Jack Tharaldson (Deacon representative) Todd Worner, and Grace Worner. Monica encouraged anyone who has suggestions or concerns about worship to talk to her or Pastor Becky and welcomed anyone interested to join the committee. The next meeting will be Monday, January 28 at 1:00.

Items of Information/Discussion

Rolinda asked Monica to address the two items on the agenda of information/discussion. Monica reported that the timeshare in Bella Vista Arkansas is available to rent for \$650 for week 39 (last Saturday in September through 1st Saturday in October). It is also possible to pay an additional fee to rent it a different week. The option to rent will continue to be offered until payment is received by Shalom.

Monica reported that Shalom has usually sponsored movies for the community 2-3 times per year and asked the congregation if there was continued interest in doing this. Following verbal affirmations, Monica noted that there has been very good turn out of volunteers to help with set up and welcoming guests, but less with delivering movie posters to area businesses or making recommendations/ choosing movies to show. She asked people to please give suggestions. The next movie will be held in February.

Ministry Goals for 2019

Rolinda noted that one of the goals identified by the Deacons for 2019 is to expand outreach, with one strategy being Big Events. Football Sunday on February 3 will be the first Big Event of the year, and a video about the event made by Eric Danielson, Dale Carlson, Wendell Erdman and Dalen Gosseling was shown. Pastor Becky explained that for the past 2 years, a group called Kingdom Builders has been studying how to restructure as a congregation in order to more effectively fulfill our mission. The Kingdom Builders curriculum suggests using "Big Events" where many members are involved in planning a specific special opportunity for members to invite others to attend. Other big events for the year will be Easter and hosting MN Adult and Teen Challenge. Pastor Becky asked people to indicate on a form passed out if they would like to be involved with planning one of these events.

Pastor Becky showed a video about a program called Life Tree Café. This is an opportunity to serve our community by combating loneliness and building community with weekly opportunities to gather and talk together about various topics. There will be training provided, and participants don't need to commit to helping every week. Use the interest form to be contacted about helping with this.

Carrie Jepma reported that having a mission trip was another strategy under the goal of expanding outreach. People interested in going on a mission trip or helping plan can indicate on the available form. Carrie has several sites she has looked into, but more ideas are welcome, and timing will be determined based on who is interested in participating. The trip will be in the United States and is open to adults 18 and older. Carrie is hoping to get discussion going soon so that there is time for fundraising. Pastor Becky said another Deacon-identified goal is for the congregation to grow as God's stewards. The first part of this goal will be addressed with a sermon series being in February related to stewardship and the blessings of living a life of passing on God's blessings. This sermon series will incorporate member testimonies. Pastor Becky invited people who would like to share a story of personally growing as a steward to contact her. The 3 rd goal is to hold conversations about our facility needs. Deacons would like to hear peoples dreams and concerns related to facilities so that the congregation develops consensus on the matter.

Election of Deacons

Rolinda reported that there were 3 deacon positions to be filled: a one-year term due to Michelle Knutson's resignation, and 2 three-year terms as Gene Hacker and Rolinda had fulfilled their terms. Dorothy Carlson, Lowell Hacker and Warren Holte offered their names for consideration. Richard Syverson made motion to cast a unanimous ballot to elect these individuals, Marlene Kennedy seconded the motion. Motion passed by verbal assent of the members with no objections. 2018 Financial Report/2019 Budget Proposal

Monica covered the 2018 financial report and 2019 proposed budget simultaneously. Most budget lines are projected to be the same from 2018 to 2019. Community Outreach and Publicity is increased primarily due to projected expenses for Life Tree Café. Pastor Becky requested an additional week of leave in lieu of a wage increase. Pastor Continuing Education is increased to accommodate Clergy Coaching. Medical Allowance is decreased due to Todd going off of the plan. Monica requested 2 additional services off in lieu of a financial increase for the Director of Music role. Monica pointed out that we actually did make budget, due to \$15,000 given as a pre-tithe at year-end 2017 for use in 2018. Richard Syverson motioned to approve and Marlene Kennedy seconded. Unanimous verbal approval. Appreciation for Service

Rolinda directed people to look at the last page of the report, listing the many ways people serve within Shalom, and said she thought everyone who attends actually does serve in some capacity. She highlighted Kris Davis and Pat Peterson who clean Ministry Center every week, and Wendell Erdman for snow removal. She thanked all who serve, and asked people to express appreciation to one another. Rolinda invited Pastor Becky to lead prayer over the Deacons, and Rolinda offered prayer over the meal. The meeting adjourned about 11:30 and fellowship continued with a potluck meal.
